Seven members from Lilydale CWA attended a group forum (all of the 63 telephone area) on the 7th March (normally our meeting day) at Riverside. This was attended by 16 of the 19 branches. A very informative and entertaining day, commencing with a presentation by Jo Westlake, a nurse who had three months in Paraguay working with local people in the health system.. Paraguay is the third poorest country in South America – the majority are poor, earning \$1.50 a day, down to 20% earning 75c a day, with 3-4 generations in one house – often 2 rooms. It takes \$60,000 to build a child care centre – hopefully we can hold a function later to help towards this cause, we will require local help.

Helen's quiz tested our brain power – a wide variety of questions to answer, several being trick, others factual. How many animals did Moses take aboard the ark? Which planet looks blue when seen from space? Locals Heather and Margaret showed hidden talents with an item.

A representative from Palliative Care spoke on the availability of support for families and clients who need the volunteers, social workers, doctors, nurses this service gives. A very caring service as is ARAFMI. A spokesperson from this organisation spoke on BIPOLAR disorder, one form of the mental illness this group gives support to.

Vera and Glenda entertained with some verses and jokes (all very clean and repeatable). To close the afternoon, Lorna gave out kits to everyone – what a lot of work – to make an identity badge for ourselves. A good, informative and varied day of fellowship.

Next meeting is April 4th – normally we would celebrate our 68th birthday with an outing – we have had to defer that until maybe June. On 4th, meet at Courthouse, 1.30 p.m. coffee and cake after the meeting. AGM is May 2nd.

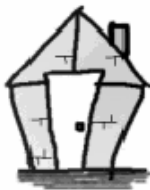

Genevieve and Lex were at their second Trials individually, but their first time as a combination. They also successfully completed all three phases. These two gained a ribbon by being part of a Northern Zone Scramble Team and coming fourth.

Molly and Nipper fought a close battle all weekend with the other clubs. Nipper just floated in dressage, and simply ate up the ground as he thundered around cross country. They were in second place after their dressage effort, and came out on top at the end of the day by winning the blue ribbon for Grade 3A. A fourth placing was also awarded to them as members of a Northern Zone Scramble Team.

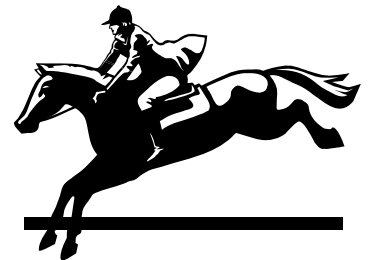

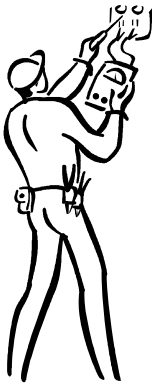

Health Notes from the Lilydale Pharmacy

Fight fat and get fit with fibre

Fitness and health go hand in hand; and while we all know the benefits of regular exercise, when it comes to the prevention of disease, diet is just as important.

The role of one of the most important components of our diet – fibre – is detailed in the Fibre and Bowel Health fact card. The card has been produced by the Pharmaceutical Society of Australia and is available at the Lilydale Pharmacy.

A low fibre diet can cause constipation and haemorrhoids. It can lead to irritable bowel syndrome and diverticular disease, where the bowel muscle is weakened and becomes inflamed. A low fibre diet can also contribute to bowel cancer and high blood cholesterol levels (meaning a greater risk of heart disease).

So we should all be eating more fibre; but that doesn't mean we have to live on carrots and celery sticks, or that everything needs to taste like crunched up cardboard. There are some very tasty ways of increasing our intake of fibre.

In fact, there are two types of fibre, soluble and insoluble. Soluble fibre is found in oats, legumes, fruit, vegetables, seeds, cereals and fibre supplements. Insoluble fibre is also found in some vegetables and legumes as well as large amounts in wheat bran. Ideally we need to eat plenty of both types of fibre.

Also important in our diet is so-called 'resistant starch'. Resistant starch is found in foods such as raw starchy fruits (such as green bananas) and pasta, potatoes and rice – depending on how they are cooked.

The reason fibre and resistant starch have this protective effect is that when eaten, they pass undigested down into the bowel where they are fermented by bacteria. This increases the bulk of the faeces, making them easier and quicker to pass; so there is less time for possible cancer-causing substances to be in contact with the lining of the bowel. As they ferment, fibre and resistant starch produce chemical substances called short chain fatty acids which seem to protect against bowel cancer.

There's another more immediate benefit from a fibre-rich diet. High fibre foods satisfy the hunger pangs much more completely. There's less likelihood you will over eat, become overweight and be more at risk of complications of conditions such as diabetes, high blood pressure or arthritis.

If fibre is not already a large portion of your diet, it's sometimes helpful to increase your intake slowly. This

avoids the sometimes uncomfortable or embarrassing side effects of intestinal gas or wind. Or you can consider the ready prepared fibre supplements – for many people they are less likely to increase gas production. These supplements are pleasant tasting and easy to take, and this often outweighs the disadvantage of their cost.

The most common supplements used are psyllium (which is contained in Agiofibre, Fybogel and Nucolox) and sterculia (in Granocol and Normacol Plus). Nucolox also contains a form of resistant starch called Starmax which is likely to have more beneficial effects.

Remember, as you eat more fibre you also need more fluid. Around six to eight glasses of water a day is ideal for most people. Eating more fibre will add variety to your diet as well as giving you all the health benefits, because foods high in fibre usually contain many vitamins, minerals and essential nutrients.

Lilydale Neighbourhood Watch

A good roll up of 16 people attended this meeting including 2 new people to the district and a local couple.

Our guest was John Lunnon from the Riverside Neighbourhood Watch and he showed a DVD on a trip he did with his wife and some other caravaners last July. They travelled Melbourne to Echuca, up the Newell Highway then up as far as Rockhampton and came back down the Bruce Highway to Brisbane and down the coast road back to Melbourne. The DVD was very interesting as it is a good record of his trip to show other people at any time. He informed us that when the Spirit of Tasmania advertises fares at \$85 that **only 15%** of all fares available on the ship, are at the \$85 price; so you will need to get in very early to get the discount prices.

POLICE REPORT

Const. Gavin Stora was on duty in our area and there was only 1 incident to report.

Between 3/2/07 and 5/2/07 at a property on the Lower Turners Marsh Road, a Thunderbird electric fence unit and 100m of electric fence wire was stolen from the roadside fence on the property.

SUSPICIOUS INCIDENTS

1. Quite a number of empty shells were found near a vehicle which was parked on the corner of North Lilydale Road and Golconda Road. Police are aware of this incident.
2. At Van Asch's corner on North Lilydale Road, 30-40 wallaby carcasses were dumped.

A lady who did her shopping in Riverside at the same time on the same day each week, went and did her shopping this particular day, got to the check-out and realised she didn't have her purse; so she went back home to get it. 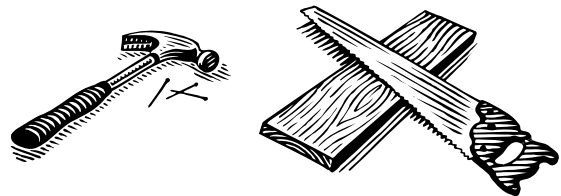

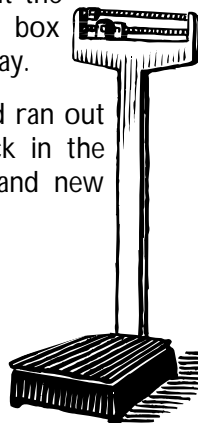

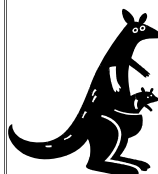
