Editorial

Over the last few months the world has witnessed Mother Nature in all her fury leash torrential rain in many parts of Australia, earthquakes in New Zealand and a tsunami in Japan. All these disasters and more, including the Japanese problems with their Nuclear Power plant are reported to us almost as soon as they happen via the wonders of modern technology.

We are able to sit in the comfort of our lounge-rooms as pictures are beamed around the world in a matter of minutes so we watch anything from tragedies to triumphs as they unfold before our eyes. Consider also the speed with which we are able to travel from one side of the world to the other, Launceston to London in a matter of days.

Now imagine if you can the world as it was ninety five years ago as those brave men from Australia and New Zealand embarked on their "Big Adventure" to fight the enemy and at the same time have a look at the rest of the world. Letters written to their loved ones at home took many months to reach their destination, and often by the time they did the writer had become a casualty of war.

Recently I read an article about the ANZACS, I would like to share part of it with you: *"The Anzacs experienced the best and worst of the Turkish climate. When they landed in April the weather was mild and progressively got better, by July the temperature was regularly between 83 and 85% Fahrenheit. But this did not accurately depict the wider realities and horrors of war that became routine. The weather became hotter, the tracks and trenches dustier, the men's thirsts could not be slaked, lice were rampant and then there were the flies. Thousands of men were afflicted with*

dysentery, infections and other illnesses. And when the harshness of summer passed biting winds set in"

Today we know within hours when someone has been injured or worse, killed. Ninety five years ago this was not the case and it was months before this sad news was relayed to those waiting at home. Not too long ago graves from WW1 were discovered by a farmer when he was ploughing his field so at last the families of some of those soldiers missing in action can now have closure. We hear and read so much of the heroism and courage of those brave members of our defence forces, I am sure the accolades heaped on them are well deserved, they sacrificed so much to keep our world safe. Many of them never returned home alive and those who do are changed forever by their experiences.

Spare a thought for those left at home to keep the wheels of life turning, think of the sacrifices they have to make as they watch their fathers, husbands, sons and daughters go marching off to war. Remember, they are the ones left behind to pick up the pieces and keep the home fires burning.

This year, as usual the Lilydale Sub Branch R&SLA will be conducting the 6am dawn service at the Cenotaph and this is traditionally followed by breakfast at the clubrooms (usually \$10 per person). The 11am service, which includes a collection for Legacy, is also held at the Cenotaph and followed by morning tea at the Memorial Hall. You are all invited to attend either or perhaps both services on Anzac Day Monday April 25th.

Lions and the Disasters in Australia around the Pacific

Everywhere there are these catastrophes, there are Lions, and we will continue to support these broken communities.



March Meeting: Twelve people attended this meeting, including our Guest Speaker David Byard.

David gave a very informative talk on topics including fresh Meat and Vegetable imports, the large supermarket chains and the effect this is having on local producers.

Police Report

On the 11/02/2011 a Subaru sedan was crashed on Second River Rd and set fire to. A suspect has been named and investigations are continuing.

On the same date a residence on Second River Rd was entered. Nothing appears to have been stolen. This is possibly linked to the previous report.

Between the 22nd and the 25/02/2011 a burglary of a shed occurred at a residence on Pipers River Rd. Offenders have slid underneath the wall and have forced open the roller door. A large quantity of property was stolen including fishing gear and camping items. C.I.B. is investigating.

On the 28/02/2011 a residence was entered on Main Rd. Lilydale and a laptop stolen. The victim was home, was in and out of the house, leaving the back door open, which faces onto the Main Rd. The computer was sitting right next to the door. The victim heard

dogs bark around 10.30am and returned inside to find the computer missing.

Between the 1st and the 03/03/2011 a motor cycle was stolen from a residence in Golconda. The victim left the bike in the garage with the key in the ignition by mistake. The garage was not secured and the bike was discovered missing on the 3rd.

As many of us these days, have GPS devices in our motor vehicles this tip from a southern Neighbourhood Watch group could be useful.

As you are probably all aware GPS devices are targeted by motor vehicle burglars and owners of vehicles are constantly asked to remove portable GPS devices from their vehicles when unattended.

Feedback from a Howrah resident suggested also advising owners of GPS devices, portable or otherwise, not to record their home addresses in the unit to avoid burglars targeting their home address after stealing the device or motor vehicle. As rightly pointed out we should know how to get home.

Police would like to remind members of the public to report any suspicious behaviour to Bush Watch on 1800 333 000 or to Police on 131444. If the matter is urgent, and requires immediate assistance, Triple 000 should be used.

Keeping safe – while you're home and away

While many Tasmanians take a holiday over the Easter Break, research shows 37 per cent are apprehensive or uneasy about leaving their home unattended in case of holiday break-ins.

It's not that surprising that so many Tasmanians are wary about leaving their home empty while they're away, as many are still not putting in place basic security measures that could easily reduce the opportunity for thieves to enter their home.

Across the country, the most common entry point for thieves is an external door such as the front or back door. Yet, two in five Tasmanian residents (39 per cent) admit they leave their front or back door open when they know they probably should not.

In addition, one-third of Hobart householders (32 per cent) fail to lock deadlocks around the home when they know they should, while 23 per cent admit their window locks are not always locked when they should be.

Tips for keeping your home and contents secure

- Remember the basics – it's no good installing locks and then not using them.
- Make sure everyone in your home is equally security conscious.
- Have a routine that everyone follows to check locks and switch on alarms when the house is left unoccupied.





- Tell your neighbours if your home is broken into – then they can remember to be extra careful and report any suspicious activity to police.
- Don't assume balcony doors or high windows are safe to leave unlocked – thieves are good at finding ways to overcome these obstacles.
- Store easy-to-carry, expensive items such as laptops, MP3 players and jewellery away and out of sight so thieves can't see them – consider installing a safe.
- Don't leave doors or windows wide open for long periods even while you're at home.
- Don't leave car keys and wallets beside open windows or doors.
- Engage deadlocks when you leave the house so that thieves cannot carry items out through your main doors. However, never leave them locked when you are in the home as they can be a hazard in case of fire.
- If you can't arrange for someone to collect your mail when you're on holiday, ask the post office to hold it until you return. Also, attach a 'no advertising material' sign to your letterbox so it doesn't overflow.
- Lock your meter box to prevent thieves tampering with your power supply.

He gave us a very interesting insight into the working and services of this magnificent organisation - helping the homeless, providing food parcels as well as many hundreds of meals each week, shelter for those sleeping out, drug rehabilitation, counselling, budget advice and there is more - and how these facilities survive, in part, from income from the City Mission shops and donations. These types of organisations need all the help we can give them. We were able to give a donation, plus two cartons of non perishable goods (mostly food) that have been collected from our roll call.

Next meeting will be our 72nd birthday celebration - members to meet at the swimming pool at 10.30 am to travel to Kouklas at Gravelly Beach on 6th April.

Stroke

Only heart attack kills more people than stroke. Stroke kills more women than breast cancer. About 88% of stroke survivors live at home and most have a disability. 20% of all strokes occur to people under 55 years old.

A stroke occurs when the blood supply to the brain is disrupted. This can occur when a blood vessel is blocked or broken.

A small blood clot or cholesterol plaque can cause a blockage. A blocked blood vessel prevents the blood from getting to the cells on the other side. These cells will die if blood is not restored quickly. If the brain cells which control speech die, then our ability to speak will be lost.

A TIA is like a 'mini-stroke' and a blood vessel may become blocked or broken for a short period of time. The body repairs itself quickly enough so that the brain cells don't die (just become temporarily sick) and they recover fully.

The FAST test (below) has been shown to recognise up to 90% of all strokes. Keep this handy so that you can use it to test if someone may have experienced a stroke or TIA

Face	Check the person's face and mouth for droop
Arm	Check to see if the person can lift both arms
Speech	Check for slurred speech and for understanding speech.
Time	Call 000 for an ambulance (or 112 on a mobile phone) if a stroke is suspected

Stroke is always a medical emergency. If you experience any of these symptoms yourself or recognise them in someone else, call 000 even if the symptoms last for only a short time.

Stroke prevention. If you have had a stroke, there are quite a few things you can do to help prevent having another stroke.

Quit smoking

Use cholesterol lowering medications to stabilise cholesterol plaques in the blood vessels.

Use aspirin or a similar antiplatelet medication to reduce blood clots.

Keep blood pressure below 130/80

Control blood sugar levels if you have diabetes.

The main risk factors for stroke are smoking, high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, AF (atrial fibrillation

– or irregular heart beat) and other heart and blood vessel disorders.

High blood pressure is the single most important risk factor to control. Medication to control blood pressure reduces the risk of stroke by 40%.

Aspirin for people in the high-risk category can reduce stroke by one third. Aspirin does not offer any benefit for low risk individuals.

People with AF often need to take warfarin. This can reduce the risk of stroke by up to 70%.

All adults over the age of 60 who have diabetes are high risk. Male smokers aged over 55 are also high risk.

Your **risk status for stroke and heart attack** can be calculated from charts produced by the **National Heart Foundation of Australia**.

The risk calculator charts take into consideration age, gender, diabetes, cholesterol, blood pressure and smoking when determining your risk status.

This Month's Recipe

Remember the chicken stock recipe from last month? Now is your opportunity to use some of that lovely stock to make a truly 'gourmet style' pumpkin soup.

Butternut Squash and Cheddar Soup

Description The tanginess of the cheddar is a perfect foil for the sweetness of the butternut squash in this warming soup. Serve it as a starter or as a main course with hearty whole-grain bread.

Ingredients

- 4 tablespoons unsalted butter
- 1 medium onion, diced
- 2 stalks of celery, diced
- 1 large (about 1.5 - 2kg) butternut pumpkin, peeled, seeded, and diced
- 4 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 6 cups chicken stock
- 1/2 cup of cream,
- 1/2 cup of milk,
- 4 ounces cheddar cheese, grated (about 1 cup)
- Salt and ground black pepper



Methods/steps

1. In a large pot, melt the butter over medium heat, add the onion, celery and squash, and sauté them for 10 minutes.
2. Add the flour and nutmeg to the vegetable mixture to form a roux and cook over medium heat for 5 minutes, stirring often.
3. Add the chicken stock and bring the mixture to a boil; then reduce the heat and simmer on low for 5 minutes.
4. Stir in the milk and cream. Purée the soup in a blender or food processor, working in batches.
5. Return the soup to the pot over low heat and gradually add the cheese, whisking until the cheese is completely melted.
6. Season the soup to taste with salt and pepper and serve in warm bowls.




