If you have children at the school, you will read something from me from time to time in the weekly newsletter; but I would like all of you out there to have an idea of what's been happening in chaplaincy at your school.

I guess my primary role as a chaplain is to work to **keep hope alive** in the hearts of our school children and sometimes in the hearts of their parents, and my colleagues on staff. I am also lucky enough to teach art as well, and so some of my one-to-one and small-group work building self-esteem involves art and craft activities.

Sometimes children just need a break from the bustle of the classroom to talk or sit quietly and make something.

I do have a bigger agenda as well, and that is to assist children to learn how precious citizenship is, how important a community is and how important our environment is. I have a lovely little team of girls who help me pick up litter in the school yard once per week, but it's not all hard work. Our wet-weather plan is grow little 'gardens' of succulents from cuttings; each girl will have her own little pot to work on.

I spend two hours on Mondays at the farm helping Liz Stanfield out with her group of students, and am always on the lookout for special visitors or speakers to enrich the lives of our 'littlies'. Soon a lunchtime knitting class will begin and we will be grateful of any community support by way of teachers. Keep an eye on the community noticeboards and have those needles at the ready!

In the first week of term, we were particularly privileged to have a visit from Emma Haswell and her fully grown pig, Celeste. Emma runs a farm-animal

rescue shelter down south and works exceptionally hard providing information about the way our meat is grown, and how our choices at the supermarket influence our agricultural practices. Our students were very responsive to Emma's message, and as consumers of the future are aware of the influence they have. Of course they all loved Celeste. I heard one little Prep exclaim, 'Boy! Next weekend, thanks to the generosity and support of the school, I am attending the big 'Working in Partnerships' conference in Hobart. The conference has many outstanding speakers and workshops, and I am hoping to bring home more knowledge and ideas to power chaplaincy at LDS. I am particularly interested in Building Community Capacity, Intuiting the Value of Others, Values Education and Making it Personal Re-engaging the Disengaged.

Speaking of generosity, our Fair Committee has purchased 'CHIC', a wonderful program for girls. **C**hoices, **H**opes, **I**nspirations and **C**onnections is designed to build peer relationships, build self-esteem and self-worth and help girls to make positive, healthy choices as they navigate adolescence. The program will run for girls in Grades 5/6/7 & 8. Part of the program will include a bit of a get-together for girls and their Mum / female mentor.


Pennant Bowlers have won the 1st semi against Ravenswood, which means they go straight into the grand final, well done folks and good luck.





On Monday August the 18th Lilydale is to commemorate Vietnam Veterans Day at the Cenotaph at 12 noon, for the Vietnam Veterans of the North East.

Last year Georgetown held the service and our turn this year. The Day is set aside to remember Long Tan, the first big encounter the Australians faced in Vietnam. It is the 40th anniversary of the battles at Fire Support Bases Coral and Balmoral. A sausage sizzle will follow.

Our next General Meeting will be held on Thurs 18th Sept at the Senior Citizens club rooms at 7.30pm.

Kokoda - The Spirit Lives

With my daughter, Emma, I walked the Kokoda Trail in June, covering in particular all sites of military significance, including Isurava, Mission Ridge, Brigade Hill, Lake Myola, Myola 2 and the Bomana War Cemetery. With out wishing to engage in a lengthy description, the experience was perhaps the most significant in my life: culturally, historically, physically and emotionally.

The Kokoda Campaign, conducted in July-September 1942 resulted in Australian forces repulsing a Japanese attempt to reach Port Moresby and thus establish a beachhead for the invasion of mainland Australia. Their attempts to achieve the same end via Milne Bay were equally thwarted.

Significant was the high command decision to send a militia battalion, the 39th, which in the first instance should have been seen as lunacy; however, the 39th excelled in its duties, blunting the Japanese advance before being relieved at Menari, having suffered considerable losses, including their commanding officer, LtCol Owen. The famous photograph, taken by Damien Parer at Menari records the condition of these brave men, referred then, and now, to "those ragged bloody heroes". And heroes they were. Despite the lack of formal training the 39th will long be remembered for their ability to resist a force of well-trained Japanese troops six times their number.

Ivan Dean is giving a presentation on his Kokoda experience (May this year with Senator Guy Barnett) at the AGM of Neighbourhood Watch at the Lilydale Fire Station at 7:30 pm on 14 August and I encourage you to attend. There I'm sure you will learn of the role played by the fuzzy wuzzy angels who played no small part in the success of the campaign, saving Australian lives by carrying injured soldiers to the rear to receive proper medical attention and supplying the troops on the front line with ammunition and rations. These magnificent people have yet to be recognised by the Australian Government.

Kokoda was the "Battle for Australia". Walking in the footsteps of heroes is more than 'ticking a box'.

Lilydale History Group







Health Notes: COLD SORES

Cold sores are caused by one of the viruses from the herpes family, known as herpes simplex virus (HSV). There are two types of HSV infections. HSV-1 usually causes infections on the face, such as cold sores around the lips and nose, whereas HSV-2 usually causes genital herpes.

The tingle is the very first sign of the HSV-1 cold sore. This tingling, burning sensation occurs even before the actual cold sore appears. It is at this time that the antiviral creams are best. We keep the generic 'Aciclovir' cream which is most effective. It is best applied about 6 times a day as soon as the tingle is felt. If applied early enough, the cold sore can be stopped from proceeding to the blister stage.

The next stage is the blister. Usually within 24 hours or so of that first feeling of a cold sore coming on, red swollen areas appear and get covered with tiny blisters. These blisters can last for several days. When they burst open and begin to weep, the virus can be easily spread to other places and people. Aciclovir is still effective but the iodine products are also effective at this stage.

After the weeping stage the cold sore dries up and forms a scab which generally heals in about a week without scarring. Blistex and Nyal lip ointments are good at this stage.

Anti-viral tablets for cold sores are now available on prescription. They can reduce the healing time of cold sores by two days. The cost is about \$30 for 3 tablets which are all taken together as a single dose as soon as the cold sore starts tingling. It would be best to have this medication all ready and waiting in your cupboard if this treatment would suit you.

Unfortunately, cold sores come back time after time because, as with all the herpes infections, the virus "hides" in the body's nerve cells away from the immune system.

We are all exposed to the cold sore virus, but not all of us will experience an outbreak of cold sores. More than 4 million Australians – over 20% of our population – report having repeated attacks.

Cold sores are easily transferred from person to person, and they can be particularly dangerous if caught by babies or people taking medicine that affects their immune system. People with cold sores are most infectious when there are sores or blisters present, or in the days just before an outbreak. There may be no permanent cure for cold sores yet, but you can do a lot to prevent them. Dry, burnt lips present the ideal conditions for a cold sore to break out. Regular use of a sunscreen lip balm will prevent many cold sores.

Keep some antiviral cold sore cream handy to use as soon as you feel the tingle start. If you have very frequent attacks, perhaps regularly taking Lysine tablets will prevent them. Reducing chocolate and nuts may also help.



A Fitness Group for Lilydale?

It is now well understood that the benefits of exercise are many; it helps to keep your strength and energy levels higher and it can go a long way to reverse the effects of Type 2 diabetes. Exercise too will also stave off the risk of getting diabetes, many people today do not even realize that they may be at risk of becoming a diabetic. Exercise helps to keep joints flexible, and movement, balance and strength is increased which will help prevent falls and broken bones.

Exercise helps tone muscles and gives us a younger fitter appearance. Exercise burns up unwanted calories and therefore assists us to keep body weight within a desired range. Exercise helps to give us better tolerance to "work" such as digging, walking and all activities so we have the ability to do more in our day. When we have some exercise we are able to sleep better and sounder and generally exercise increases our sense of wellbeing and how we feel about ourselves.

There would be an added saving on fuel and travel time if there was a local fitness group available.

With all this in mind we want to gauge how many people there are in the broader community who would participate in some fitness activities at the Lilydale District School Gymnasium.



Neighbourhood Watch Report

13 people attended this meeting including our Guest Speaker, Bruce Scott.

The yellow lines have finally been painted outside the Village Green but the one outside the Post Office was missed. The names of the Zone Leaders who have served our area for more than 15 years have been sent in to Steve Bauld and the I.D. cards for all Zone Leaders are on the way.

Guest Speaker

Bruce Scott from the Scottsdale R.S.L. club spoke on what is being done up there. They have a Military museum which is the second best in the State and it was only started 7 years ago. If it had been started 40 years ago there would have been a lot more memorabilia in there. As it was, a lot of that went to the tip. A life-size carving of Simpson and his Donkey with the wounded soldier on his back is being done by the same person who did the carvings at Legerwood. It will be placed at the entrance to the Museum in Scottsdale and will be a Memorial for all R.S.L. veterans. 2 Veterans from W.W.1 brought back a pine tree whose parent tree was the actual Lone Pine. It was planted on Ken Williams' property and had a plaque placed at the base. The Council have since bought the property, which is now the Sewerage Works. 3770 soldiers were buried at Port Moresby and the names of most of them are on the head stones. The unknown ones have an inscription saying "Here lies a brave soldier - only God knows his name."

Bruce then spoke about his last trip to China. He has a daughter working there teaching Computers in a school in Shanghai. The population of Shanghai is 20 million. Traffic is hectic and it took 70 minutes to reach the school where she worked and she was only 25 km from the airport. He stayed with her for a while and then went further out into the country areas. He said if you want to buy something you really must "haggle" as they like to do that. Things were a lot dearer this time than when he went 3 years ago. The pollution is also worse



Recipe of the Month:

Apple Cake - submitted by Robyn East

Ingredients:

4 granny smith apples
Sugar to taste
1+ 1/2 cups s.r. flour
2 teas. cinnamon
125g butter
1/2 cup castor sugar
1 egg



Method:

1. Peel, cut up and stew apples, sweeten to taste set aside. Sift dry ingredients into basin rub in butter and add sugar. Bind together with beaten egg, a little milk may be added to make a pliable dough.
2. Divide mixture in half, roll out to fit into a well greased 20cm. round sandwich tin.
3. Spread drained, cooled apples over.
4. Roll out remaining dough and place over apples.
5. Bake at 190C. for 30-35 mins.
6. May be iced with lemon icing.
