Memories, Remembrances and Anecdotes:

Last year, we mentioned in the Progressive that the history of Lilydale was in danger of being lost and that we would really like to get down on paper some of the stories and memories from local people. Unfortunately, as is usually the case, the lack of any funds to facilitate this meant that we were not able to successfully implement the program.

In September 07, a grant (admittedly small) was applied for through the government's 'positive ageing' initiative. We are pleased to say that we were successful and so there is some money now available.

The on-line access centre will be a major player in this program. The facilities and expertise there will enable folk to bring in their old photos, have them copied and the originals returned to them, and the copies used for historical purposes.

We have also been promised the loan of two more note taker dictaphones for recording stories, anecdotes and remembrances.

So, we now have some money, some machines, Jayne's expertise in photo enhancement etc, some willing helpers (Kathy Hawes and Gayle Mahnken have both 'volunteered') (there will be ample opportunities for more volunteers if you would like to help).

What we need now, are local folk willing to come along to some morning/afternoon gatherings with their photos, stories and memories.

The next Progressive will have a broad outline of the time line for the Project.

In the meantime, we would like to ask you all to delve through your 'sheds', under the lino, old suitcases, cupboard drawers, tops of wardrobes, bottom of wardrobes, grandad's old tin trunk, your old handbags, treasure boxes, old photo albums etc, etc, etc. (haven't got room for all the places that 'old' things are harboured) for: photos, memorabilia, old invitations, tickets, programmes, notices, school reports and photos, business ads, newspaper articles about Lilydale, Minutes of old organisations. Anything you think might be of interest and there is no limit to what interests people about their community's past.

Get togethers will be held to sort and document the material that you bring along from your scavenging. It should be great fun.

We will be using the Village Green Information Board, signs in various businesses and the Progressive to keep you up to date with happenings.

Even though we would love to see you at the get togethers, if you can't make it, please still consider being involved by supplying your treasures and memories of 'old and not so old Lilydale.

At the end of the project we hope to display some of our findings on the wall at the Village Green, Multimedia DVD's could also be produced. Information will be appropriately held in various archives, including here in Lilydale.



PBS issues.

The 'PBS safety net' for prescriptions has been in existence for over 10 years. The PBS (or Pharmaceutical Benefits Scheme) safety net is only for PBS listed medicines.

Two levels of pricing occur for PBS prescriptions.

1. Concessional Rates: These apply to pensioners, holders of a health-care card, war veterans and holders of certain senior's cards. For these people a benchmark PBS prescription costs \$5.00.
2. General Rates: Holders of a medicare card are entitled to benchmark PBS medicines for \$31.30 (or less if the item costs less)
3. Some medicines are not on the list of PBS items and are priced independently as private prescriptions.

The PBS safety-net card can be obtained when a 'family' (this can include de-facto relationships) reaches a certain threshold of expenditure on PBS medicines in a calendar year.

1. Concessional PBS safety-net
2. The PBS safety net threshold for concessional families is \$290.00 (or 58 prescriptions). If this is reached then, for the rest of the calendar year, each member of the family pays \$0, instead of \$5.00, for benchmark PBS scripts.
3. General PBS safety-net

The PBS safety net threshold for general families is \$1141.80. If this is reached then, for the rest of the calendar year, each member of the family pays \$5.00, instead of \$31.30, for benchmark PBS scripts.

It is up to you to know when your family has reached the limit. To help you keep track of your prescription costs you can:

Always go to one pharmacy and ask for all your family members to be linked together. The pharmacy computer will do the work and tell you when you qualify for the safety net. OR

Carry a PRF card around with you (available from all pharmacies) and ask each pharmacy to record the prescriptions on it. OR

Make sure that every pharmacy you visit has your family members linked. Regularly ask the pharmacies that you visit how much you have paid. When you reach the limit, ask each pharmacy for a PRF printout, take them all to one pharmacy and ask for a safety net card. If you have overspent you can ask for a refund.

The federal government only subsidises each drug up to the price of the cheapest equivalent tested product. If a drug company will not accept the 'benchmark' price then the customer must pay the price difference. (Hence, some prescriptions cost more

Aussie Lamb Chops BBQ Recipe

If there's one thing Australians understand, it's how to make great lamb chops. This recipe lets you in on the secret.

Ingredients:

- 2 tablespoons currant jam or jelly
- 2 tablespoons ketchup
- 2 tablespoons soy sauce
- 2 tablespoons brown sugar or honey
- 1 tablespoon dry mustard
- 2 teaspoons Worcestershire sauce
- 12 lamb loin chops, cut 1 inch thick and trimmed (about 3 pounds)
- 6 slices pineapple, about ½ inch thick

Method:

In a small bowl combine currant jam, ketchup, soy sauce, brown sugar, mustard, and Worcestershire sauce.

Place lamb chops in large resealable plastic bag. Pour marinade over lamb chops.

Close bag and marinate in refrigerator for 15 minutes.

Remove lamb from marinade; discard marinade. Place lamb and pineapple slices in center of cooking grate.

Grill pineapple for 5 to 7 minutes or until grill marks appear, turning once halfway through grilling time.

Grill lamb chops 7 to 9 minutes for rare (140°F/60°C), 10 to 13 minutes for medium (160°F/71°C), or 14 to 17 minutes for medium-well (170°F/77°C), turning once halfway through grilling time.

Serve lamb chops with grilled pineapple rings.

Makes 6 servings.

than \$5 for a pensioner). There is usually a generic equivalent for any medicine where a 'brand price premium' applies.

Different pharmacies sometimes use different generic brands. This can create confusion.

Avoiding changing brands is another good reason for using the same pharmacy for all of your prescriptions.

Using the same pharmacy also allows the pharmacist to better understand your health issues.



- Any obscure problem which does not appear easily diagnosed, and the machine seems to have power to it (lights on, nobody home):
 - Reboot, the PC. Only worry if this fails to fix it.
 - Never overlook the obvious. Most problems have mind-bogglingly simple causes, e.g. the power cable is loose, the screen-unit was "helpfully" switched off by someone, the ethernet cable was unplugged, and the printer-cable was borrowed by the person in the next office while you were on holiday.
- Older PCs need a little more patience than newer ones. However the older ones still have more than enough power for most things you want to do. Don't try to run too many programs at once. If you start Word, Excel, then Photoshop, etc. ... you may overload the computer's memory (RAM), and you will lose work.
- Remember that a computer is only a tool: it cannot think for you. If it does something "stupid", it's because you told it to.
- The likelihood of your PC failing is directly proportional to the length of time since you last saved the urgent report you're working on. *Always* save your work regularly especially before printing, print-previewing, spell-checking etc.
- If something has gone disastrously wrong, try the UNDO button. If that doesn't work, ask for help before you touch anything else.
- Learn the difference between Close and Minimise.
- Use anti-virus software and keep it up to date

- Don't click too fast! Multiple mouse clicks get queued up, not ignored. A queue of clicks will result in confusion and damaged files. If things aren't happening on your computer, stop and ask yourself (or the Help Desk Advisor) why.




