Ok, I'll admit it not only am I an Auction junky I'm also addicted to stationery, I can't seem to walk past places like Officeworks, Birchall's or Regal without popping in to see what new kinds of paper and tooly, gadgety things there are available. I trawl the aisles, eyes darting back and forth, ooooh look a pretty new scrapbook paper, ahh a special type of glue, glitter, paint, stamp, marker, technique etc, etc, etc.

With the advent of the Internet my obsession has only increased, now I can shop online and purchase from around the world, punches from America, stamps from Japan, tools from the UK, a recent purchase of the coolest tool I've ever seen re-energized me to start making cards again (if you've never seen one go to www.crafterscompanion.co.uk and check out the Ultimate Crafters Companion).

There's only one problem (and it's a major one) I've now got so much stuff it's getting hard to remember where I stashed it all. (I'm sure I'm not alone here.) So instead of one room with all my ~~junk~~ treasured and really useful stuff, I have 3, and none of them are really set up just right.

I sigh for the space in our old home back in Victoria, where we had a loft and I could craft to my heart's content upstairs with 20 foot long benches on either side and enough space to do it all, sewing, beading, papercraft, whatever the current fad was there was room for all.

Now I'm restricted, I have my sewing machines in one room. I bead on the front verandah and my paper crafting is limited to a tiny office (I mean REALLY small about 8 feet by 5 feet), what this all means is that there is a huge mess EVERYWHERE.

So my latest resolution is a big cleanout and organisation of every last craft item in the house. **It's going to be tough,** there will be tears (especially when it comes to getting rid of some of my collection, again I know all you crafty people out there will totally understand this!). There may even be tantrums, but I am determined, by the end of the process I WILL be able to put my hand immediately on the sequined ribbon flower thingies I bought in bulk and many colours from China about 5 years ago!

The last meeting on Tuesday 2nd May 2012 we looked into some issues around BLW installing a giant water tank at the entrance to the Rhododendron Gardens. As it turned out the LCC 'stuffed up' and so BLW left the LCC out of it and went straight to the review planning authority - (an unelected body) to their credit the LCC went ahead and refused the planning application anyway - what a drama.

Our survey results came to light and the LDPA was then a lobby voice for our community and it's united view that BLW has failed to consult. Full results are available on request.

New members joining the LDPA is always a good sign especially at this time of year when those who feel the cold find it hard to get out and about.

On 28th May Deputy Major Jeremy Ball put a Motion to Launceston City Council.

"That Council facilitates a public meeting between Ben Lomond Water (BLW), the Department of Health and the Lilydale community in order to explore matters associated with BLW's plans for a new Lilydale Water Supply and that this meeting be arranged as soon as is practicable."

In the Examiner 23rd May BLW announced a Public Meeting will be held in the Lilydale Memorial Hall at 6pm on 14th June 2012.

The Village Market has closed for the winter and it is expected that the Market Subcommittee will form come to our next meeting - keen to take up the opportunity to carry it on in the future.

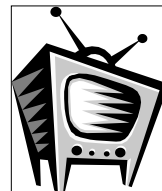

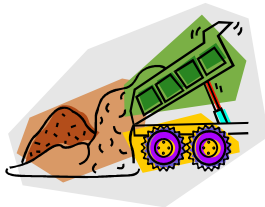

Grant for local landholder

Jillian Weston is one of only three private landholders in Tasmania to receive a grant from the Australian Government's Biodiversity Fund for her project "Protecting, enhancing and restoring riparian habitat".

Project description: Ongoing control of invasive introduced species, willow, blackberry, ragwort and hemlock and continued revegetation with mixed endemic species to improve connections between native remnant vegetation across public and private land in the fragmented rural landscape of Tasmania.

This requires securing the riparian zone from livestock with a permanent electrified fence to create a wildlife corridor from remnant native forest on my land to the Lilydale Falls Reserve adjacent. To facilitate continued control of invasive species, the purchase of a designated spray unit would enable the landowner to carry out maintenance of this wildlife corridor using non-residual, eco friendly chemicals recently developed for riparian use. \$12,000 over 1 year.

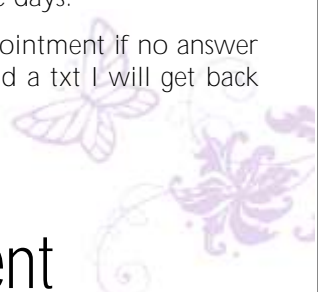

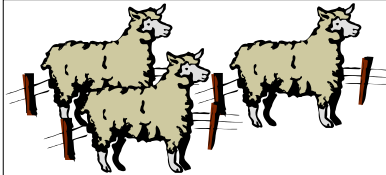

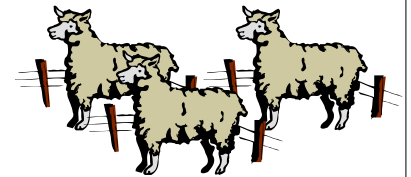

Cold Sores

Cold sores are caused by one of the viruses from the herpes family, known as herpes simplex virus. There are two types of herpes simplex infections. Type 1 usually causes infections on the face, such as cold sores around the lips and nose, whereas type 2 usually causes genital herpes.

The tingle is the very first sign of a cold sore. This tingling, burning sensation occurs even before the actual cold sore appears. It is at this time that the anti-viral creams and tablets are most effective.

The next stage is the blister. Usually within 24 hours or so of that first feeling of a cold sore coming on, red swollen areas appear and get covered with tiny blisters. These blisters can last for several days. When they burst open and begin to weep, the virus can be easily spread to other places and people. Antiviral creams and tablets are still effective but the iodine products are also effective at this stage.

After the weeping stage the cold sore dries up and forms a scab which generally heals in about a week without scarring. Blistex and Nyal lip ointments are good at this stage.

'Compeed' cold sore patches can be used instead of creams, and provide an invisible covering which relieves pain and enhances healing. These can be used at any stage of the infection, but sooner is best.

Anti-viral tablets for cold sores are now available over-the-counter without a prescription. The cost is about \$30 for 3 tablets which are all taken together as a single dose as soon as the cold sore starts tingling. It would be best to have this medication all ready and waiting in your cupboard if this treatment would suit you.

Unfortunately, cold sores come back time after time **because the virus "hides" in the body's nerve cells away from the immune system waiting for a 'trigger' to start** a new infection. Common triggers are sunlight, a cold, or stress (e.g. an important event like a wedding or exams).

There may be no permanent cure for cold sores yet, but you can do a lot to prevent them. Dry, burnt lips present the ideal conditions for a cold sore to break out. Regular use of a sunscreen lip balm will prevent many cold sores. Keep some antiviral cold sore cream or tablets handy to use as soon as you feel the tingle start. If this is used early enough, the cold sore can be prevented. If you have very frequent attacks, perhaps regularly taking Lysine tablets will prevent them. Reducing chocolate and nuts may also help.

Cold sores are easily transferred from person to person, and they can be particularly dangerous if caught

by babies or people taking medicine that affects their immune system. People with cold sores are most infectious when there are sores or blisters present, or in the days just before an outbreak.

We are all exposed to the cold sore virus, but not all of us will experience an outbreak of cold sores. About 1 in 5 people report having repeated attacks.

Rhododendron Garden News

It is with great sadness that we acknowledge the recent death of Harold Walker. Three generations of the Walker family developed large areas in Lalla as orchards, nurseries and a flower farm from the late 1800s. Harold returned from service in the Navy in WW2 to manage the nursery and flower farm business (later known as the WAG Walker Rhododendron Reserve) through to 1965. Harold was also part of the management committee that helped transition the property from a large commercial nursery into a public reserve of great beauty and horticultural value leased and run by the Tasmanian Government from 1981 to 2007.

When the property was sold to us Harold provided much encouragement and historical information helpful in the restoration of this wonderful garden property. An absolute gentleman and wealth of expertise, his passing marks the end of an era for these gardens, and his presence will be greatly missed. Our deepest sympathy is extended to his family.

On the weekend 8-9 June we invite you to visit the gardens and enjoy a walk through some of the more recently restored areas of the property. The old **reserve area will be available for picnics/bbq's**, but there will also be guided walks on more recently restored walking trails extending further up the hill. These trails link further extensive areas of heritage rhododendron plantings, groves of mature exotic trees and natural forest, waterfall and fern gully, over 100 new varieties of rhodos (including scented varieties, giant leaved tree species and tropical vireya rhododendrons) and interesting geological features.

The gardens will be formally open again on weekends from September to mid December during the flowering season - entrance fee will be charged.

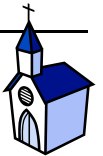
