## Tasmanian Regional Arts, Lilydale Branch

Tasmanian Living Artist's Week 2007.

The exhibits were displayed in the Old Library Room with the quilt displayed in the Foyer.

Twenty five exhibitors displaying 46 items contributed to the Exhibition.

The official opening was performed by Gillian Robnik, with approximately 75 people attending. The exhibition was opened from 10.00 am to 4.30 pm each day from 25<sup>th</sup> August to 2<sup>nd</sup> September.

A steady flow of visitors viewed the exhibits. The number who signed the visitors book was 150, not including those who signed during the Opening ceremony. So we estimate at least 225 people visited the exhibition, which is very encouraging from a Branch viewpoint and encourages the holding of future exhibitions.

The quality and the wide variety of the items in the exhibition were frequently commented on. It must be hoped that they will inspire more people in the community to use their talents and to come forward to exhibit their efforts on future occasions. There is no doubt that the younger exhibitors enjoyed having their efforts on display and that should encourage more younger artists and photographers to be more active.

As part of the 'Living Artists Week', Jennifer Scott held a Traditional Chinese Painting workshop in her studio. The maximum number of participants booked for this very interesting workshop and a further workshop was held to accommodate the overflow of interested people.

The Feature Artist, Shelley McLeod of the Appleshed Gallery at Karoola, gave

a very interesting floor talk on the final day of the Exhibition.

It was very pleasing to the Branch to be able to display Shelley's work to the local Community and wider audience.

All in all, the Living Artists Week was judged a success by the local Branch and it is envisaged that the Exhibition could be held bi-annually.







## Health Notes

from the Lilydale Pharmacy

### Sunburn

Unfortunately, Australia is the world's skin cancer leader. The fact is that the pleasant environment we all enjoy so much can be big trouble for our skin. Deliberate or intentional exposure to the sun such as from sunbaking is potentially the most dangerous.

Each year 150,000 new cases of skin cancer are reported, including more than 5,000 cases of the potentially fatal melanoma. More than 1,000 of these people will die from this almost preventable disease.

Although fair skinned people are at greater risk, people with all skin types are at some risk of getting skin cancer. Most damage to the skin is caused by regular overdoses of the sun during childhood and adolescent years, and new research indicates that over exposure to the sun may also trigger the growth of other cancers. Too much sun can damage our immune system.

Severe sunburn is an additional risk factor. Getting sun burnt six or more times when we are young, doubles the risk of melanoma. Apart from the long-term damage, we all know the short-term pain associated with sunburn.

Sunscreens are important, but they are not enough - hats, clothes and sunglasses are also needed.

Ideally, sunscreens should be applied evenly to clean dry skin at least 15 minutes before going outdoors. And make certain you reapply the sunscreens every two hours - even more frequently after swimming and exercise. However, any sunscreen is better than none - try to get into a habit of applying sunscreen every morning to hands, face and neck, even if it's cold or

overcast. If it's a sunny day, then put more on at lunchtime – to all exposed skin. Recent studies have shown that 'rubbing in the sunscreen' is not as effective as just lightly covering the skin and allowing it to settle on its own.

Sunscreens will block the production of vitamin D in the skin, but we only need about 10 minutes exposure

to the sun (head and arms only) before 11am or after 3pm in the summer. Most people will have no trouble getting these 10 minutes, even if you are a meticulous sunscreen applicator. (If you are concerned about vitamin D, then a multivitamin or a fish oil capsule each day will do the job.)




There is a fee of \$5 to cover the cost of materials. You don't need to bring a GPS but if you have one and want to download your data bring it along.


