POLICE REPORT

A Humble Apology

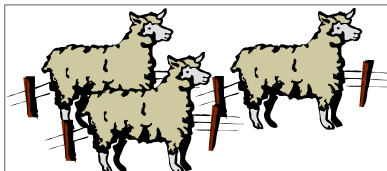

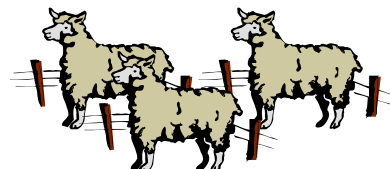

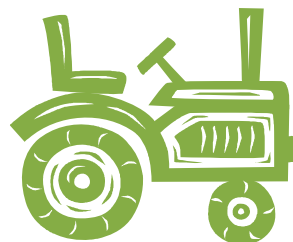

Menopause.

Menopause is the time when a woman stops having her menstrual periods. It marks the end of her fertile years, just as the first period in adolescence marks the beginning. The fall in hormone levels that occurs during this time can cause other changes in a woman's body.

For most women, menopause spans a 2 to 6 year period, between 45 and 60 years of age. Menopause involves a sudden or gradual loss of the two female hormones, oestrogen and progesterone, which are produced in the ovaries. These hormones influence a woman's mood, weight, body shape, appetite, skin, sex drive, bladder and sexual function, blood vessels and bone density.

Most women feel well during menopause, and have very few symptoms, but some women can experience unpleasant effects. Some of the symptoms of menopause are; irregular periods, overheating, hot flushes, night sweats, dry or itchy vagina, dizziness, rapid heart beat, crawling sensations under the skin, headaches, joint aches, anxiety, irritability, depression, crying a lot, difficulty sleeping, being tired, frequent desire to pass urine and reduced interest in sex. These symptoms can start years before the periods stop. If menopause symptoms reduce the quality of life, they can be controlled with hormone replacement therapy (HRT). HRT is used for the minimum time necessary – which is usually only up to 5 years. HRT is no longer used as long-term therapy for osteoporosis.

After menopause, lower amounts of female hormones can lead to thinning of the bones (and fractures later on), sagging of the uterus and vagina, urine leaks with coughing and sneezing and increased risk of heart disease. Smoking worsens all these issues, so if you are a smoker, this is a good time to stop.

To minimize bone thinning (osteoporosis), calcium intake should be 1200mg per day. This can come from 3 serves of any of the following; one cup of low fat milk, 200g low fat yoghurt, 35g of cheese. Vitamin D is also needed to ensure that the calcium gets into the bones. Adequate Vitamin D can be obtained by exposing the face and arms to the sun for 15 minutes each day. Calcium and Vitamin D supplements are available if needed.

Regular exercise is always beneficial, and walking is one of the best as it is weight-bearing (which strengthens bone) and generally doesn't aggravate arthritis.

Phytoestrogens (plant oestrogens) replace some of the natural oestrogens lost during menopause, and may reduce symptoms, cholesterol levels and blood
