New Residents

The Lilydale Neighbourhood Watch welcomes new residents to the area and advises that the meetings for the area are held on the second Thursday of the month at the Lilydale Fire Station, Doaks Road commencing at 8pm during daylight saving and 7.30pm for the remainder of the year.

Residents new and old, are most welcome to attend.

September Meeting

10 people attended this meeting including Sergeant Jason Jones of Newnham Police.

Jason is the officer in charge of the Newnham Police Station and was able to attend our meeting in the absence of Terry.

Jason read out the Police Report, which was one of the largest we have had in some time.

Police Report

Between the 18th and the 19th of August 2012, a burglary of a shed at the Lilydale School occurred. A padlocked door was forced but when the offender(s) entered the shed an audible alarm went off and they left prior to the schools contact person arriving. A 2 stroke petrol container was the only item removed.

The matter is unresolved and being investigated by local police.

Overnight on the 22nd of August 2012, a shed was **burgled at a property at O'Tooles Rd, Underwood.** A wooden panel was forced from a sliding door on the shed. This allowed the offenders to gain entrance to the shed. Two Stihl chainsaws, one a Farm Boss and the other one a Magnum, both orange and white, were stolen along with a Honda generator, total value \$1500.00.

Between 26th and 27th August, food, groceries and money \$160.00 was stolen from a house in **Kettles Road Retreat. The victim's mother was in the house asleep at the time of the burglary.**

Between the 31st of August and the 3rd September 2012 offenders gained access to an excavator at Excalibur Rd and knocked down 6 trees and drove the machine about 50 meters where they damaged a Tiger Cat harvester. Approx. \$2700 damage occurred.

On the morning of the 11th September 2012 a timber shack at 480 Tunnel Road burned down at about 4am. Police are treating the matter as arson and want to talk to anyone that has information on this incident.

Of note, in the Northern District, there have been a number of incidents where property, including tools, chainsaws etc. have been taken from insecure sheds, garages and building sites. It is a timely reminder not to

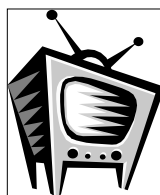

More Important Information

Fire Warning on Clothes Dryers:

Just a reminder for people to take special care when using clothes dryers particularly during the winter when they are used more often.

Householders should be aware of the dangers of dryers that have not been properly maintained. Most house fires caused by dryers can be avoided by:

- Cleaning the lint filter after each load of washing is dried.
- Allowing the dryer to finish the cool-down cycle otherwise a build-up of lint in the filter can overheat and catch fire.

Lilydale Pool

The Lilydale Pool Committee plan on opening the pool for the 2012/13 Summer Season on Saturday 1 December 2012.

Over the next few months employees from Launceston Aquatic will begin preseason work, which will include draining, inspecting and repairing the pool and surrounds.

During Winter there was some damage to the pool edge and some minor damage to other areas of the complex. The Lilydale Pool Committee have a small budget, however it is a burden to have to pay for this unnecessary damage.

When the pool opens it will be supervised by fully qualified lifeguards, trained by Launceston Aquatic. A number of lifeguards are from the local community and the Committee is keen to increase the number of locals involved in the operation of the pool, as it provides better local knowledge, community interest and local employment.

A Petition is being undertaken, to request for a moratorium on the proposed pipeline, until proper consultation has taken place on all options that are available to supply Lilydale with clean potable water.

At the time of going to press the Petition has approx. 330 local signatures and 92% of the householders in the Lilydale Water District have signed.

Diarrhoea and Vomiting.

There are many causes of diarrhoea and vomiting. Such as;

- **Viral 'gastro' is a very common cause of diarrhoea** and vomiting, and can be caught from untreated water or contaminated food.
- Bacteria can infect food or water to cause food poisoning, and often starts dramatically several hours after ingesting the food.
- Parasitic gut infections (Giardia) can persist for weeks, and are often caused by contaminated water (bush walkers often get this from drinking the water from mountain streams). Antibiotics are used to treat this.
- Medical conditions such as irritable bowel syndrome, inflammatory bowel disease and appendicitis.
- Some medicines e.g. antibiotics, cancer treatments.
- Lactose intolerance
- Alcohol, caffeine
- Anxiety

A 'Gastro' bug has been going around the district recently. Viruses often cause diarrhoea, vomiting and gut cramps. These may only last 24 hours but can linger for many days. Sometimes flu symptoms occur after the diarrhoea and vomiting, and this is called **'gastro flu'**. **Dehydration can result from a gastro** infection.

Treatment

Eating regular meals usually makes the gut infection worse. Avoid food until you are feeling well. Drinking fluids is most important to avoid dehydration. The best drinks are the re-hydration drinks/icy-poles. These should be sipped or sucked very slowly and frequently.

The sachets need to be mixed with boiled and cooled water. Lemonade is OK when you are starting to recover, but it should be diluted with boiled and cooled water to about quarter strength. When you feel well enough to start eating again, try to avoid meat and dairy products until your gut recovers properly. Diarrhoea can cause temporary bowel damage, which can impair the digestion of lactose in dairy products (causing more diarrhoea).



Babies with diarrhoea and vomiting should continue to be breast-fed, or formula-fed. Feeds should be offered in smaller amounts, but more often, and oral re-hydration solution offered frequently between feeds. The formula may need to be changed to a lactose-free formula.

There are medications available from a pharmacy to ease vomiting, diarrhoea or cramps if the above treatment is not enough.

You may need to consult a doctor if;

- A baby with diarrhoea and vomiting is under 6 months old.
- Slowly sipped fluids cannot be kept down, and more than 12 hours has passed.
- The vomit contains blood or brown/green bile.
- There is severe pain; or fever over 38 degrees.
- There are black or bloody bowel motions.
- Signs of dehydration develop.

Signs of dehydration include;

- Dark urine.
- Little or no urine for 8 hours.
- Dry mouth, tongue, lips and no tears.
- Tired, dizzy, irritable, headache, muscle cramps.
- Sunken eyes, cheeks, abdomen. Shadows under the eyes.
- Cold clammy skin. Skin stays up when pinched.
- An irritable, sleepy or floppy child.

Severe dehydration can develop rapidly in the very young and the elderly; it requires medical management from your doctor or hospital.

Prevention

Transmission is usually by contact with infected hands or food. If you are suffering with a gastro infection your hands will be contaminated and you need to wash frequently with soap and water or hand sanitiser (Aqium gel). If you are preparing food, you are likely to infect the food. You may be infectious for up to a week after you have recovered from a gastro. During this time you may be passing the virus on to other people via food preparation or hand contact.
